A Client Story: Sherrie Pollard

When Sherrie Pollard's children were taken away from her because of her years-long drug addiction, it spurred her to get her life in order. She split from

her husband, who was a drug dealer, spent three months in rehab, and went back to school, earning a college degree. She has even self-published two novels, which she describes as horror stories with a Biblical twist.

But being a single mom raising four teenagers has not been easy. In March, Sherrie and her family lost their apartment and became homeless. "We go in and out of motels," she said. But when there is not enough money for that, the family lives in her car.

This summer, Sherrie began coming to Food Pantry Lax, which provides homeless people with food that does not require cooking or refrigeration. Her children look forward to what they receive. "This is the one place they always say, 'Mommy, don't forget to go on Tuesday,''' she said.

Sherrie, 51, was born in Tampa, Florida. Her mother died in childbirth and her father, who was in the military, was deployed to Vietnam. So as a toddler, she was moved to Inglewood to be reared by an aunt and uncle.

A few years ago, she earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from Cal State Long Beach. But she has not been able to

find full-time employment. She works at concerts and sporting events, taking tickets, checking bags and helping customers find their seats. The job pays only minimum wage, though it has flexible hours, making it easier for Sherrie to care for her children.

"I'm ready to go back to work full time," she said. She is also trying to find a new place to live, working with the nonprofit St. Joseph Center, which provides housing assistance.

Sherrie said that eventually she hopes to be able to repay Food Pantry LAX for its assistance. "I can really see myself coming in here one day with a truckload of stuff" to donate for others in need, she said. •
